Water Trucking in Gaza

Water trucking is currently the only way citizens of Gaza are able to get water. The drinking and wastewater infrastructure is completely destroyed. HHRD works through a vetted local partner to source water resources already established within the Gaza strip and deliver it to the population. Every day, our dedicated team members drive to a different distribution point, filling buckets with lifesaving water.

I am Saleem, 10, I have 2 small sisters and mom, who I take care of as much as I can since the death of my father during the war. Since the beginning of the war, we have been forced to displace more than 5 times to prevent any brutal bombing!

Unfortunately, after being displaced for 3 times, and about to displace for the fourth time, my father was killed during bombing, and that left me the biggest man in this family! Anyway, I tried to do my best to take care of my family. I even tried to find a job, but no one would take a 10-year-old kid!

We used to live depending on donations! And my biggest concern was to find proper food and water during Ramadan! But Allah solved this concern by getting us water through Helping Hand for Relief and Development! We can now have clean drinking water for some days! Washrooms in Gaza

Homeless and constantly displaced, the people of Gaza are forced to designate poorly concealed open areas or walk long distances to relieve themselves. Disease is rampant due to unsanitary conditions, and there is little that can be done by outsiders due to the blockades.

Working with a vetted local partner, HHRD is able to source washrooms from inside Gaza, constructing them and delivering them to places in need. This intervention is vital to the hope, survival and dignity of the population.

Solar Based Drinking Water Solutions in Pakistan

In a remote village, 25 kilometers from Layyah, Masjid & Madrasa Al Qadoos Anwar e Mustafa faced severe challenges due to the absence of a reliable water source, forcing students and teachers to rely on scarce, unsafe water from distant locations. HHRD addressed this critical need by installing a solar-based drinking water system (SBDWS) after conducting a detailed assessment of local conditions. The transformative project provided continuous clean water for drinking, sanitation, and kitchen gardening, immediately improving the situation by reducing waterborne diseases and eliminating the need for students to miss classes to fetch water. The school was even able to establish a productive garden that supplied fresh vegetables to the community while teaching valuable agricultural skills.

Borehole in Africa

In the first half of 2025, HHRD successfully completed a critical water infrastructure project in Garsen, Kenya, installing a solar-powered borehole system at Maua Compr. School. HHRD CEO Javaid Siddiqi traveled to Kenya to preside over the opening ceremony.

Prior to this installation, the entire community faced significant water access challenges, with residents spending half their day fetching water from distant sources. The school itself previously lacked basic water facilities, creating barriers to education and attendance.

"First of all, we didn't have a tap, like we are drinking only salt," a student explains

The system utilizes solar-powered pumps to extract groundwater through the borehole, ensuring sustainable and environmentally-friendly water access for the school community. It is expected to significantly improve school attendance, with officials projecting that girls' enrollment will double due to improved water availability.

1,000 estimated direct beneficiaries not including community members with access to a closer drinking water source.



Ongoing Support

MENA - Lebanon & Jordan

Syrian refugees have been living in desert camps in Jordan and Lebanon since 2011, struggling to maintain plans for the future while facing difficult conditions. HHRD supports these communities in numerous ways, one of which is through water and sanitation hygiene.

The WASH program delivers fresh drinking water via truck and provides technologically advanced water storage systems that are bacteria resistant. We install home water filtration systems for Palestinian refugees living in poverty, freeing them from the burden of purchasing water or drinking sediment-heavy municipality water.

HHRD also delivers sturdy, prefabricated family washrooms to ease the indignities of life in the desert. These washrooms feature a water tank that is refilled regularly. The water can be used for drinking or farming, as well as wudu, showering, using the toilet and washing hands.

Finally, we deliver hygiene kits full of necessary personal and family products to ensure that brothers and sisters can keep their homes clean and safe. Kits contain soap, combs, toothpaste, toothbrush, feminine products, prayer mats, hand sanitizer, etc.

In the first half of 2025, HHRD completed 2 Afrediv Handpumps in Afghanistan. These pumps are designed to support villages where groundwater is easily accessible.



"Now I Can Smile" – A Young Girl's Story

Nangarhar, Afghanistan

My name is Amina. I live in a small village. I am 8 years old, and I go to school.

Before this water pump was built, every morning I had to wake up very early. I walked a long way with my mother and sister to find water. Sometimes, the water was dirty. Sometimes, we didn't even find enough. I was often tired. I missed school days.

But now... everything is different.

With this new water pump in our village, I can drink clean water. I can wash my hands. I can help my mother at home — and I still have time to go to school.

My little brother is no longer sick from dirty water. We are happy.

Because of you, I can smile. I can learn. And I can dream big.

Nepal

In Nepal, HHRD completed construction of a Drinking Water Treatment Plant and 4 Community Hand Pumps with Bio-Sand filtration. It is important to include a filter to purify the ground water, and the eco-friendly bio-sand filter requires no chemicals.
